This is one of seven classes that we call the "7 Habits". The purpose of 7 Habits is to teach everyone what a Christ-driven life looks like. It's our main pipeline for the entire church. It's something we want everyone to go through because it puts us all on the same page.

GOAL OF 7 HABITS: Commitment to live a Christ-Driven Life.

Seven Habits of a Christ-Driven Life

Week 1 – Obey God

Week 2 - Love Others

Week 3 - Daily Worship

Week 4 – Small Group Involvement

Week 5 – Attend Church

Week 6 – Serve Faithfully

Week 7 – Give Sacrificially

So here are some basic facts about 7 Habits...

- This is not intended to be your church fix. Please attend worship service.
- People can enter these weeks at any week. We just want them to complete all seven weeks.
- This not a traditional Sunday School class. We hope and pray that after seven weeks, people make strong commitments to these seven habits and LCFC.
- We want everyone who attends LCFC to go through these classes.
- If you have gone through the Membership Class at LCFC, we ask that you attend the seven weeks related to living out a Christ-Driven life.

LOVE OTHERS

There are three questions that we're going to look at...

- 1) What is love?
- 2) How do I love God with all my heart, soul, mind, and strength?
- 3) How do I love others as myself?

John 13:35 (NLT) 35 Your love for one another will prove to the world that you are my disciples."
Your love will to the world that you are a follower of Christ. This is the distinguishing attribute. It's not where you live, the clothes you wear, the family you were raised in, it's not your good deeds, it's not where you work, the primary characteristic will be your love.
1 John 4:7-11 (NLT) 7 Dear friends, let us continue to love one another, for love comes from God. Anyone who loves is born of God and knows God. 8 But anyone who does not love does not know God—for God is love. 9 God showed how much he loved us by sending his only Son into the world so that we might have eternal life through him. 10 This is real love. It is not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as a sacrifice to take away our sins. 11 Dear friends, since God loved us that much, we surely ought to love each other.
QUESTION 1 – WHAT IS LOVE?
God is It's part of the very character of God. It's His DNA. It's who He is.
John 3:16 (NIV) 16 "For God so <i>loved</i> the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.

1 John 4:7 (NLT)

7 Dear friends, let us continue to love one another, for love comes from God. Anyone who loves is born of God and knows God.

In fact, when John says, "Dear friends, let us continue to love one another". The original Greek language says it like this: "Divinely loved ones, let us habitually love one another."

In fact, we may even have a CHECKLIST. I will love you IF...

- You never hurt me
- You never hurt those I love
- You do good things for me
- You respect my space
- You don't become an inconvenience in my life
- You don't annoy me

This kind of love is different from the kind of love described in the O.T. The Greek word is called "agape". It's a brand word for a brand thing. It's mentioned very few times in the O.T. But it's the kind of love that is described in the N.T.
Matthew 5:44-48 (NLT) 44 But I say, love your enemies! Pray for those who persecute you! 45 In that way, you will be acting as true children of your Father in heaven. For he gives his sunlight to both the evil and the good, and he sends rain on the just and on the unjust, too.
46 If you love only those who love you, what good is that? Even corrupt tax collectors do that much.
47 If you are kind only to your friends, how are you different from anyone else? Even pagans do that.
48 But you are to be perfect, even as your Father in heaven is perfect.
